What to Expect

We look forward to welcoming families to Summer Camp 2026 at The Sent Christian School. Our program offers a joyful, faith-centered summer experience.

Rooted in Christ

This summer, campers will explore what it means to be Rooted in Christ (Colossians 2:6–7). Through age-appropriate lessons and activities, children will develop confidence, kindness, and a strong sense of purpose grounded in their faith.

Weekly Focus & Activities

Each week will highlight Christian values such as trust, perseverance, gratitude, courage, and joy. Over the six-week program, campers will participate in a variety of activities, including:

- Sports and outdoor play
- Art and creative projects
- Language arts and creative writing
- Math with hands-on activities
- STEM exploration
- Engaging group activities

Each week features a unique theme designed to inspire learning and enjoyment throughout the summer.

Weekly Themes

Campers will participate in daily worship,

Sports Week (June 29 - July 2)

Kyung Hee Logos Martial Arts (KLM) will offer a dedicated Sports Week Program designed to promote physical fitness, teamwork, self-discipline, and positive character development. Students will participate in structured, age-appropriate activities led by qualified KLM instructors in a safe and well-supervised environment. Throughout the program, students will be introduced to a variety of sports, including soccer, basketball, pickleball, and taekwondo, with an emphasis on fundamental skills, cooperative play, and respectful participation. No prior experience is required, as instruction is tailored to each student's developmental level to ensure an engaging and positive experience for all. KLM is honored to contribute to a healthy, active, and enriching program for students.



Art Week (July 6 - July 10)

This week, artists will embark on a wild jungle adventure where they will dive into creative hands-on projects! Each day will ignite creativity while exploring the wonders of the jungle and learning about the artist Henri Rousseau. From painting, drawing and sculpting; artists will create vibrant artworks of different animals and nature. We will end the week with an art show displaying the artworks into the world of the jungle!



STEM Week (July 13 - July 17)

During STEM week we will practice science concepts and skills through hands-on application and activities. They will also become engineers throughout the week and develop critical thinking skills by solving problems while applying their knowledge of math, physics, and chemistry. The engineering projects will include building walls, towers, rockets, and launchers. We will also incorporate technology in an engineering project.



Weekly Themes


Math Week (July 20 - July 24)

We will dive into math concepts through project based learning! What better way to learn how to apply what they learned in the classroom, but by applying it to real life situations? How exciting would it be for your math lover to create their own food truck and have people order off their menu?! How fun it would be to start up your own aquarium?! What about learning how to start a business and pricing items and having people come by to purchase from their shops?! This week is loaded with tons of fun real life math situations that engage kids at all ages!



Language Art (July 27 - July 31)

This week, students will explore different types of literature as they dive into their roles as writers and readers. They will be exposed to picture books, plays, short stories, comics, as well as researching using non-fiction books. The students will also review language skills through games and other activities throughout the week. We will celebrate with an author's celebration at the end of the week! The goal is for students to find joy and purpose in reading and writing while fine tuning and reviewing skills learned throughout the school year.



Fun Week (August 3 - August 7)

Fun week is all about helping campers develop social skills while having fun! Through various icebreakers, team-building exercises, and games this week will focus on helping students develop communication, teamwork, patience, strategy and creativity. If you register for all six weeks, a 5% discount will be applied to the total tuition.

Non-refundable registration fee of \$100 will apply upon registration. The Deposit is not Credited towards payment of tuition.

Payments must be submitted within 30 days from registration date. For Early Bird registration (on or before March 1, 2026), full payment must be received by March 1, 2026. If payment is not received by this date, the registration will be canceled and regular tuition rates will apply upon re-registration, subject to availability. From March 2, 2026, all payments must be submitted on the day of the registration. **There will be no credit or refund throughout the 6 weeks of summer camp, regardless of holidays, student absences, or school closures due to inclement weather, natural disaster, or an “Act of God,” which prevents school operations.**

Cancellation & Refunds: To receive a refund for weekly fees paid for camp, cancellations must be received in writing to the school administration at least 30 days prior to attending the first week of camp. Cancellations received within 3 weeks prior to the camp will receive a 50% refund. Cancellations received within 2 weeks of the camp are not eligible for a refund.

Academic Enrichment

English as a second language (ESL)

Our summer camp offers an English as a Second Language (ESL) class for students who need additional language support. Class sessions will range from 30 minutes to 1 hour, depending on enrollment.

While other campers participate in workbook activities and Bible time, ESL students attend a separate, dedicated ESL class. Instruction focuses on language development with an emphasis on improving speaking skills through interactive and engaging activities.

ESL Program Fee: \$50 per week

Camp Schedule

Our camp day begins at 8:30 am and will run until 3 pm. Morning drop off will begin at 8:25 am and dismissal will start at 2:55 pm. All campers must be picked up by 3:00 pm. Extended care is available for an additional cost. Pre-registration is required.

Extended Care Fees:

- Morning Care (7:00am - 8:30am) \$55 per week
- Half After Care (3:00pm - 4:30pm) \$55 per week
- Full After Care (3:00pm - 6:00pm) \$80 per week

!Important Camp Details

Lunch & Snack

You have the option to purchase a lunch or pack your own. Campers should bring their water bottles and a healthy snack every day. We provide water refills throughout the day.

Attire & Belongings

Kids should wear the provided camp t-shirt with comfortable shorts or bottoms to be able to participate in the daily activities. Active shoes are required. No crocs or flip flops. Skirts and dresses should be worn with shorts underneath. Electronics and toys from home are prohibited in camp. Please label all of your child's clothing and personal belongings.

Registration

Space is limited and camps fill up quickly. Additional waivers and forms are required to be completed prior to attending your first day of camp and will be sent via email to you after you complete your initial registration. The following documents are required: Birth Certificate, Health Form (with updated immunization records) , Parent Handbook and Financial Agreement.

Payments

To secure your spot in camp you will need to pay in full for the weeks you are registering. Payments must be submitted within 30 days from registration day or before March 1, 2026. From Mar 2, 2026, all payments must be submitted on the day of registration.

Cancellations & Refunds

To receive a refund for weekly fees paid for camp, cancellations must be received in writing to the school administration at least 30 days prior to attending the first week of camp. Cancellations received within 3 weeks prior to the camp will receive a 50% refund. Cancellations received within 2 weeks of the camp are not eligible for a refund.

Disciplinary Policy

As a Christian school, we believe in the importance of shaping the students to be Christ-like in their thoughts and actions. Students are expected to live according to the Word of God, responding to one another in love, and growing in the development of Godly character as described in Galatians 5:22-23: "*The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, gentleness, and self-control.*" It is the goal of TSCS to train up the students to abide by the Biblical teachings of Christ. Students are expected to be respectful to the teachers and follow the rules and regulations of the school.

At TSCS, we believe that all students should be treated with the love of Christ and should be disciplined with the love of Christ. Our teachers use positive reinforcement to encourage the students to demonstrate Christ-like behavior. The children are expected to show respect and obedience towards their teachers. Age-appropriate consequences are given when students consistently react in defiance or misbehavior. We believe that a strong partnership and transparent communication with the parents are essential to addressing behavior.

Discipline Policy:

- First Offense - Warning: Teachers will give a verbal warning to redirect the student's behavior and correct them to meet the classroom expectations.
- Second Offense - Warning: Teachers will give a second verbal warning and provide clear consequences if the student does not correct their behavior.
- Third Offense - Consequence: Teachers will give a consequence to the student, appropriate to the offense. Consequences can be:
 - a. Reduce Play Time (# of minutes to sit out will be equivalent to the child's age)
 - b. Removal of Student from Activity
 - c. Relocation of Student from Activity
 - d. Student removed from the classroom and sent to the Principal's Office
- If the child continues to demonstrate disobedience after the consequence, the student's parents will be notified and the child will be sent home.
- The following behaviors will not be tolerated and result in an immediate suspension for 24 hours.
 - a. Physical violence and acts of aggression toward others
 - b. Excessive verbal aggression or inappropriate language towards others

Disciplinary Policy

Disciplinary Action:

TSCS emphasizes the importance of collaboration between the family and the school in addressing behavior and discipline. If there is no improvement in the student's behavior even after the full implementation of the discipline policy, the school may decide that TSCS is not the right fit for the student. TSCS reserves the right to terminate the contract and withdraw any student causing disciplinary issues or disruptions to the learning environment. It is important to note that no refunds will be issued for students requested to withdraw under these circumstances.

Harassment and Bully Policies:

Bullying is any negative verbal or physical behavior that is done (a) directly to a person or person's property, (b) with the conscious intention of either upsetting a person or manipulating the person's behavior, which (c) God would not approve of. – *Bullying and the Bible* There are 4 types: physical, verbal, relational and cyber.

The behaviors listed above will not be tolerated and result in an immediate suspension for 24 hours or more. Anyone can report an incident by sending an email to TSCS@kcpc.org.

TSCS is committed to fostering a respectful, supportive environment for all individuals in the community. Bullying in any form disrupts this atmosphere and will not be tolerated. Together, TSCS aims to uphold values of kindness, love, and respect in every interaction, as taught through our faith. This policy applies to students, and parents, ensuring that everyone in the community is treated with dignity and compassion. By working together, a safe and positive environment for all can be created.
