Summer Camp Fees

There is a \$100 Camp Registration Fee for each participant. Camp Registration Fee is non-refundable. This fee includes a workbook, 2 camp t-shirts, materials, and activities fees.

Tuition is \$300 per week for current TSCS students and \$325 for non-students during the early registration period ending March 31. Starting from April 1st the weekly tuition rate will be \$350 for current TSCS and non-students.

Discounts and Special Rates (Only one discount per family)

- There is a 5% discount when you register your camper for all 7 weeks of camp.
- ◆ Siblings receive 5% off the second child
- There is a 5% discount for military families (Active and Veterans) and first responders with valid ID.
- Christian Pastor (Full Time) receives a 25% discount.

Registration is open to the community starting Feb 13, 2023 and spots will be assigned on a first come, first served basis.

Camp Schedule

Our camp day begins at 9:00 am and will run until 3 pm. Morning drop off will begin at 8:45 am and dismissal will start at 2:55 pm (pick up by 3:00pm). Before care (7am-8:45am) and after care (3pm-6pm) are also available for an additional cost. Pre-registration is requested to ensure the spot for extended care.

Extended Care Fees:

- Morning Care (7:00-8:45am) \$50 per week
- Half After Care (3:00-4:30pm) \$50 per week
- Full After Care (3:00-6:00pm) \$75 per week

Important Camp Details

Lunch & Snack

You have the option to purchase a lunch or pack your own. Campers should bring their water bottles and a healthy snack every day. We provide water refills throughout the day.

Attire & Belongings

Kids should wear the provided camp t-shirt with comfortable shorts or bottoms to be able to participate in the daily activities. Active shoes are required. No crocs or flip flops. Skirts and dresses should be worn with shorts underneath. Electronics and toys from home are prohibited in camp. Please label all of your child's clothing and personal belongings.

Registration

Space is limited and camps fill up quickly. Additional waivers and forms are required to be completed prior to attending your first day of camp and will be sent via email to you after you complete your initial registration. The following documents are required: Birth Certificate, Health Form (with updated immunization records), Parent Handbook and Financial Agreement.

Payments

To secure your spot in camp you will need to pay in full for the weeks you are registering. Payments must be submitted within 30 days from registration day or before March 31, 2023. After April 1, 2023 all payments must be submitted on the day of registration.

Cancellations & Refunds

To receive a refund for weekly fees paid for camp, cancellations must be received in writing to the school administration at least 30 days prior to attending the first week of camp. Cancellations received within 3 weeks prior to the camp will receive a 50% refund. Cancellations received within 2 weeks of the camp are not eligible for a refund.

Summer Camp Weekly Themes

Campers will participate in daily worship,

Art Week (June 26-30)

With artists like Monet and Matisse as our muses, your child's creativity will run wild with the projects in store! From abstract sculptures to painterly landscapes, your child will get a feel for so many types of artists and develop their own style on their journey through meeting different artists! Mary Blair is another feature artist that we will learn all about her intense use of color and how that got her to become an artist at Disney and created It's a Small World!

STEM Week (July 3-7)

During STEM week we will practice science concepts and skills through hands-on application and activities. They will also become engineers throughout the week and develop critical thinking skills by solving problems while applying their knowledge of math, physics, and chemistry. The engineering projects will include building walls, towers, rockets, helicopters, and launchers. We will also incorporate technology in an engineering project.

Writing & Reading (July 10-14)

This week students will be reading and exploring text from a variety of sources including picture books, plays, comic strips, and short stories. Letting their creative energies flow, students will then create their own literary works to be presented at the end of the week for our Writers' Awards Ceremony and Celebration!

Music Week (July 17-21)

During this week campers will explore 3 musical components: Choir, Instruments and Dance from several countries around the world. The week will conclude with a concert of the World Song Parade.

Math Week (July 17-21)

We will dive into math concepts through project based learning! What better way to learn how to apply what they learned in the classroom, but by applying it to real life situations? How exciting would it be for your math lover to create their own food truck and have people order off their menu?! Another exciting project is to create carnival games with probability in mind! We will get to see how carnival game creators can either rig the game or make it easier to win!

Sports Week (July 31-Aug 4)

Sports week is a summer intensive that will help campers explore their athleticism in order to help them THRIVE! Thrive is a non-profit Christian sports and enrichment organization that is dedicated to discovering and developing every child's gift, character, and leadership. We exist to make disciples of Jesus Christ through sports and competition. We hope the kids at Thrive will grow up to become leaders who will impact the world around them. We call these the 3Ds: DISCOVER, DEVELOP, and DISCIPLE. During Sports Week, Thrive campers will engage in training drills and play basketball, dodgeball, handball, and volleyball.

Fun Week (August 7-11)

Through various icebreakers, team-building exercises, theater, and games this week will focus on helping students develop communication, teamwork, patience, strategy and creativity.
